

Foundation Ted Henderson Our Program: District 5300 Four Way Speech Contest



From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is The 4-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI president) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. This 24-word test for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The 4-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways. It asks the following four questions:

"Of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"

Today we were fortunate to hear 4 speakers and their talks about the 4-Way test and how it relates to this year's theme "*Peace through Service*". The motto of this year's Rotary International President, Sakuji Tanaka.

A Summary of the speeches:

Speaker 1: Speaker one spoke about selfless acts of kindness, as well as compromising your time without self-gain in mind, so that you can utilize that time to help others instead.

Speaker 2: Spoke about people that make a difference by giving themselves and their time up to make another's life better. For her, it was her grandfather. - Tabitha Goodall

Speaker 3: Spoke about community involvement and a small contribution from everyone and how far that'll go with participation from everyone across the globe. - Farah Zadi

Speaker 4: Spoke about peace starting with an individual as the root of underlying conflict, and that change comes from the ideal within one's self. - Peter Houston-Hankin

The winner was Peter Houston-Hankin and was awarded a monetary prize and an opportunity to compete at the regional level.
