TODAY'S SPEAKER: Bruno Bowles, Manager, [Las Vegas Springs Preserve](#)

Las Vegas Springs Preserve consists of 180 acres dedicated to nature walks and displays and is owned and operated by the Las Vegas Valley Water District. The Preserve is located approximately three miles west of downtown Las Vegas, Nevada. Bruno recounted a short history of Las Vegas ("The Meadows")-William Clark-Stewart Ranch and water rights-1905-Clark's town site-north well field-still pumping groundwater-1962 artesian springs stopped flowing-ground dropped 6 feet-1963 first well-new attraction at LVSP is "Boomtown" which features 4 of the original "railroad" cottages-come visit the Charleston Heights pumping station, the only one that you can actually visit and view how it operates-Nevada State Museum sits on top of a 20 million gallon underground reservoir-archeology at the LVSP may yield stone points and dinosaurs-90% of water comes from Lake Mead and 10% from wells.
