THIRD The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service

Mauricia Baca, Executive Director of [Get Outdoors Nevada](#), has over 25 years of experience working across a wide range of environmental issues. Ms. Baca became Executive Director in January 2010. Previously, Ms. Baca worked with The Nature Conservancy (TNC) for five years in their Nevada Chapter. The latter three years were spent leading the southern Nevada office.

Ms. Baca served as a trial attorney for the United States Department of Justice (DOJ) from 2000 through 2004 in the Wildlife and Marine Resources Section of the Environment and Natural Resources Division. Ms. Baca joined the DOJ through their Attorney General's Honors Program. Ms. Baca's non-profit and community outreach experience includes working in New York City as the city-wide community organizer for the New York Public Interest Research Group's Straphanger's Campaign, a mass transit advocacy organization.

Ms. Baca serves as Chair on the Tule Springs Fossil Beds National Monument Advisory Council and as a member on the Transportation Resource Advisory Committee for the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada and the City of Henderson Comprehensive Planning Healthy Communities Stakeholder Group.

In 2016, Ms. Baca was honored as Citizen Planner 2016 by the American Planning Association, Nevada Chapter. In 2017, Ms. Baca was honored with the Carolyn M. Sparks Founders Award. Ms. Baca is an alumnus of the Metro Chamber of Commerce Leadership Program, Class of 2013.

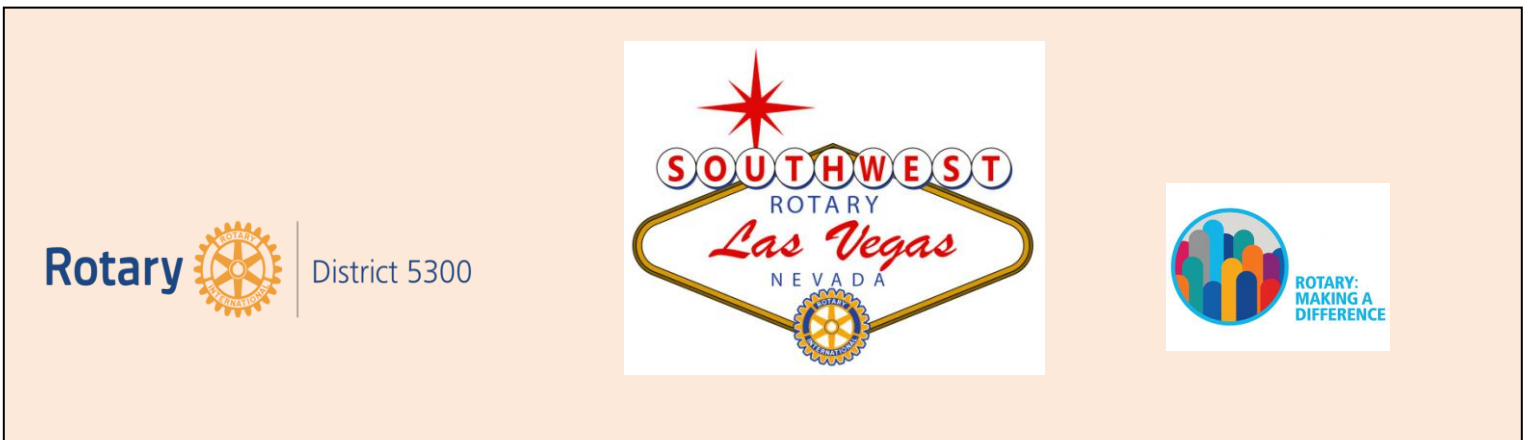

Paul Harris Fellow Award

The presentation of Paul Harris Fellow recognition is The Rotary Foundation's way of expressing its appreciation for a substantial contribution to its humanitarian and educational programs. It is named for our founder, Paul Harris, a Chicago lawyer who started Rotary in 1905.

Rotary International's goal of World Peace and Understanding is a step closer today as *Lisa and Ian Bobak* become Paul Harris Fellows, being named by *Joanne Blystone* because of their friendship and dedicated service to our community and our Club. At the end of 2016-2017 Rotary year more than *US \$3.6 Billion* have been given to The Rotary Foundation.

It is because of gifts such as *Joanne's* that The Rotary Foundation is able to carry out an array of programs that achieve beneficial changes throughout the world. As an example:

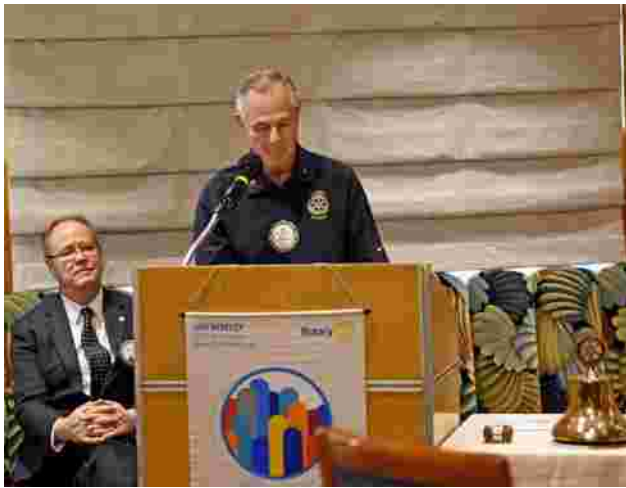
- **Rotary World Peace Fellowships** - Begun in 2002, the program sponsors up to 95 scholars each year to study at one of six Rotary Centers for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution for a two year masters-level degree. To date 1,177 Fellows from 120 different countries have participated for a total cost of almost \$54.2 million. **In 2016-2017, 95 Peace Scholars from 41 countries began studies at the six Rotary Centers at a cost of \$4.6 million for the two year program.**
- **Polio Plus** - To date, 210 countries, territories and areas around the world are polio free, and more than *2.5 Billion* children have been immunized. By June 30, 2017 Rotary has committed more than **US \$1.6 billion**. **2016-2017 expenditures were \$108.3 million.**
- **District Grants** – These grants of up to \$30,000 support smaller-scale, short term projects related to the Foundation's mission. **In 2016-2017 the Foundation approved 494 district grants, and program awards totaled US \$25.8 million.**
- **Global Grants** – These grants, in excess of \$30,000, support large-scale international activities with sustainable, measurable outcomes that support Rotary's areas of focus; activities include Peace and Conflict Resolution, Disease Prevention and Treatment, Water and Sanitation, and Basic Education and Literacy. **In 2016-2017 the Foundation approved 1,260 global grants, and program awards totaled US \$72.9 million.**

In honoring *Lisa and Ian Bobak* as Paul Harris Fellows, they join a distinguished group of more than *1,304,580* other Paul Harris Fellows around the world, all of them recognized for their devotion to the ideals of good will, peace and understanding.
