INDUCTION CEREMONY – RALUCA PETRE

Raluca Petre was inducted into the club today. Jack Woodcock presented her background to the club and welcomed her as the newest member of the Rotary Club of Rotary Southwest. She was presented with the obligatory bottle of wine and other accoutrement and allowed to take a few minutes at the podium without fear of fine! Welcome, Raluca!!

Raluca hails from Romania. She came here in 2014 with her husband Bogdan who is also Romanian as well as their son Luca who is now 14 years old. They have been married 18 years.

In Romania she was a planning and pricing manager for Toyota Romania. Bogdan had a natural farm where they raised animals with organic procedures much like free range ranching. It started when they wanted to raise their son in a healthy way. In deciding where to come to America, they chose Las Vegas because of the weather. They have friends here and, we live in a horizontal world. By that reference, she is claustrophobic and avoids elevators whenever possible.

They both had to reinvent themselves when they came to America. She started work as an administrative assistant for a real estate agent. Bogdan started as a food server at night and went to HVAC school during the day. They made their schedules work around caring for their son.





Bogdan received his certification and started working in the heating, ventilation and cooling business immediately. They started their own HVAC business called Wave Heating and Cooling in 2019.

Raluca obtained her real estate license in 2017 and they bought their first home the same year. She had to wait until the home closed to get her real estate license in order to qualify for the loan. She feels this is a good example of how you must follow the rules much like "fake it until you make it".

Her real estate license is currently at Realty One, however, her focus is growing their HVAC business. She very seldom has a real estate transaction. The HVAC business is mainly from referrals; however, the home warranty program opens a lot of doors for them. Because of their good service, this increases their referrals. Their goal is to be referral only. It is a very difficult

business because the sheer amount of advertising by the large companies such as Gottel, One Home, and Yes! air conditioning. They cannot take any time off in the summer. In fact, their son is currently in Romania by himself with their family because of their work schedule in this industry. Their approach to building their business has been focused on quality work and their reputation.

Since they don't have the advertising budget, they treat every customer in a very personal way much like they want to be treated, "a very novel concept". They focus on repair not install. If the unit needs to be replaced, they can certainly do that; however, their choice is to repair. This one fact sets them apart from the competition. The goal of most HVAC companies is to replace A/C units instead of repairing. In the field, their biggest challenge is companies that do shoddy work or are doing work on the side not as their primary business. This can be compared to other professions when there is a lot of people getting licensed because that business seems attractive until they find it takes a lot of real work to be good at it. Bogdan and their company have worked hard and received the NATE certification. (North American Technician Excellence certification), something they are very proud of because it is based on knowledge of the industry. Only 2% of the technicians in the US have this certification.

Raluca's journey to become a member of our club has been a little bumpy. Her first visit was the first week in January when she visited with her sister who is Rotarian in Romania. A few days afterwards, she fell and broke her elbow. It was an extensive injury with a long recovery. She now has enough range of motion to become self-sufficient.

She has already participated in some of our fund-raising events and looks forward to getting very involved in our activities and making new acquaintances.

Let's welcome Raluca to the Las Vegas Southwest Rotary club, in our opinion, the best club in all of rotary!


NAME THAT MEMBER
